

Business Opportunities



INCO – Los Pelambres



- 60.000 tons of additional copper per year.
- Investment of U\$ 1,700 million.
- Desalination plant in commissioning stage



The PAO Project is being activated (US 1,200 million) and the EVU Project will be activated in the future

DMC - Centinela



- 130,000 tons of additional copper per year.
- Investment of U\$ 3,700 million.
- This Project will be submitted to the Board of Directors for approval during the second half of 2023.
- It includes the expansion of the seawater pumping system, a new concentrator plant and the development of Encuentro Sulfuros pit.

A portfolio of tenders for services and goods for operations for US 4,000 million per year will be added, which covers the entire value chain, from blasting to the port, passing through the mine and Oxides and Sulfides processing plants.
